It will be the young people brimming with talent and energy and hope who can claim the building that so many in previous generations never realized.

Together, let roll up our sleeves and continue building our community here in Houston, the place our children will flourish. Let's build the cornerstones upon which the generation after us will harvest growth and pride. Together let us walk this journey through the darkest of hours and the best of times.

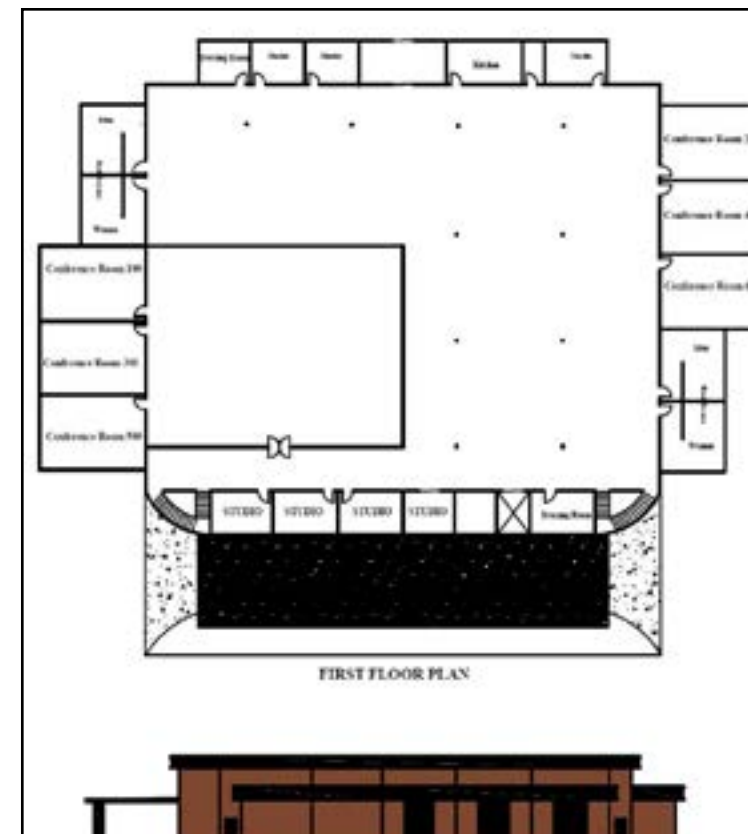
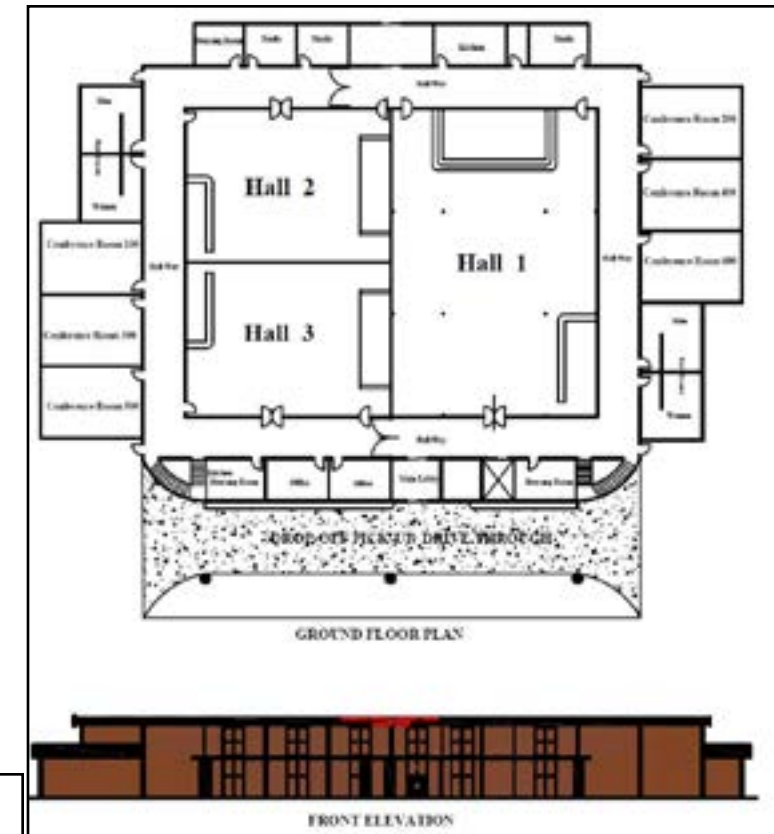
The vision of CAMCOH is to be an umbrella organization that will strive to bring all Cameroonians and well-wishers to collaborate in a non-profit and service organization.

She owns and runs Kingsbridge Rx Pharmacy in Houston TX, where she precepts 4th year pharmacy students on clinical rotation. Dr. Atang is one of the founding Board Members of Cameroon American Community of Houston (CAMCOH), and is the Founding President of the Catholic Womens Association (CWA) in Houston. She is also the Founding President of Saker Ex Student Association in Houston. She has authored several publications including research papers presented at International Conferences

and published articles in Cameroon Panorama, Time and Life Magazine and other magazines in Cameroon and in the Diaspora.

Mrs. Atang has been a political activist, involved in the creation in 1989 of the Cameroon Anglophone Movement (asserting the right to independence of the former British Trust Territory of the Southern Cameroons) and participated in the Conference that led to the 1993 historic "All Anglophone Conference" in Buea, the springboard of the creation of the Southern Cameroons National Council (SCNC). In 1991, she was an Active member of the Social Democratic Front (SDF) – the main opposition party in Cameroon, and was a catalyst in the establishment of the SDF Political Party in Houston, Texas in 1994, and thereafter the creation of the SDF in the USA. She also participated in a Southern Cameroons international conference in Dallas that gave birth to the Way Forwards Network group in 2007.

Mrs. Atang is a recipient of several awards and recognitions, including The World Union of Catholic Womens Organization (WUCWO) for selfless service in the Catholic Womens Association (CWA) 2012, CAMCOH leadership award, through CWA (2013), Outstanding Sakerette from her alumni Association EXSSA USA (2004) and many certificates for volunteer work. She is a bona fide volunteer who has consistently raised funds for the American Cancer Society, American Heart Association, American Diabetes Association, Leukemia & Lymphoma Society.

By age eight, he was in the streets of Bamenda selling cake and helping his mom in her commercial avenue clothing store. He later attended Sacred Heart College and Lycee Bilingue Yaounde.

After, Marinus obtained a scholarship to attend the University of Wisconsin Whitewater. During summer vacations, he would go door-to-door selling encyclopedia to support himself through college. A passion for creativity drove him to study and earn a degree in marketing. Marinus decided to expand his educational career with an MBA from Texas Southern University. He finished top of his class and graduated with honors. The astounding achievement awarded him a position with Dynegy, as a Senior Analyst for Gas and Power Trading.

In 2007 Marinus founded Ennovative Solutions, a marketing and software design company. Taking advantage of free wifi and evading rents, Marinus made Starbucks his permanent office for two years following. Soon however, it became discontending to hear blending coffee while attempting to have a business conversation. In 2009, he moved into an office. 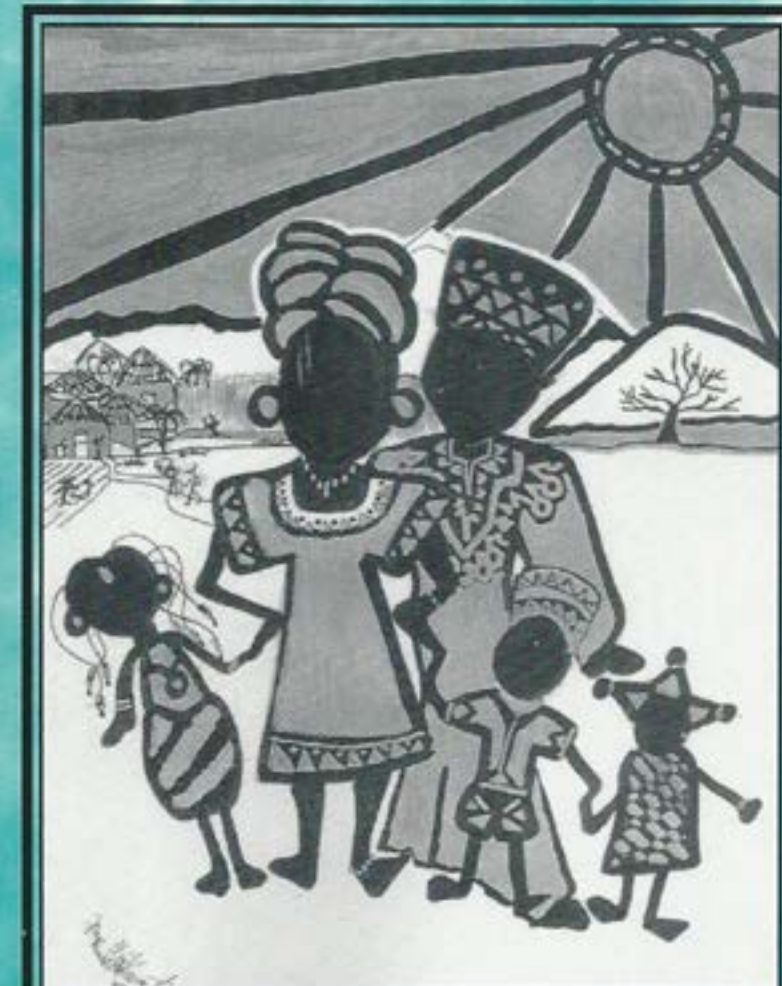
